
### **Cyber Security Tips with Josh Dean, IT Security Expert**



Mobile phone text scams, spam and phishing¹ have been on the rise! Recently, an uptick in fake Medicare messages have been used to phish victim information. Scammers often target older adults and will ask you questions to gain pieces of personal data, such as your name, your age, your address or birthday in an attempt to gain the information to extort you at a later time or steal your identity. Clever thieves will also comb your information on the internet to piece together what they need to commit their crimes. Scammers will also ask you to click on what may appear to be legitimate links, like a "bank website" or a "fraud alert". At first glance, the text messages may seem like innocent "wrong numbers" disguised as innocent. **DO NOT BE FOOLED!** 

#### Follow these best practices for unusual text messages:

- Never answer ANY questions from unfamiliar phone numbers.
- DO NOT respond and BLOCK the number by clicking on the unknown number, and selecting "BLOCK" on your mobile phone.
- NEVER click on any link from unverified sources.
- Always VERIFY requests (even urgent requests) by someone claiming to be a friend or family member through trusted means like saved, known phone numbers.
- Always call banks direct or log into your accounts through verified websites and phone apps.





As part of your membership, Carquinez Villagers can submit a service request if you suspect you've become a victim of cyber theft or crimes, or if you have any questions regarding your digital security.

1. "**Phishing**" is the term used to describe a fraudulent technique used acquiring your sensitive data, such as personal identification, bank account numbers, passwords, etc.

## Elder Initiative Report: Your Utility Bill

We are looking at issues that could well affect Carquinez Villagers: this month, increased utility rates and how you can

make your voice heard.

In 2022 the California Legislature passed a law (AB 205) that would add an uncapped Utility Tax of \$30-\$70 a month to everyone's electricity bill, with unlimited potential to grow. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will set the amount this year.

This law has brought protests from environmental and housing groups, because the legislature passed the increase in three days without any public hearings.

There are discounts available through PG&E, but the income maximum is \$40,000 for two.

Here are things you can do:

- 1. Write a protest letter to the CPUC and demand a hearing to justify rate raise. Click here.
- 2. You can also protest to your state legislators, Bill Dodd (707-551-2389) and Lori Wilson (707-438-7359), as well.

### **Villagers Play Bocce Ball**

What is bocce ball? It is trying to roll your team's balls closest to the small yellow "pallino" ball, rather like horseshoes.

Or, as Carquinez Village team leader Barbara Feth said with a big grin, "our emphasis is on having fun!"

The CV team meets on Wednesdays, 10:30 am at the city Bocce ball court behind the Benicia library, playing on traditional hard packed sand courts.

Barbara explained that 4-8 people on a court can form two opposing teams to get points for rolling their balls closest to the pallino. They can knock opponents balls away or tap their own balls closer. Since there are 4 courts our CV team can accommodate 32 players. Currently we have around 12 regulars, and we would love to have more, says Barbara.

"We all deal with various physical/visual/hearing/cognitive challenges," she adds, "but that doesn't stop us from having a great time."

The team discourages bringing food or drinks, but players often go out to eat afterwards.
